DIVING PRE-REQUISITES:

Our Whale Shark Exploration Program is open to everyone, including those without any diver certification...yet!

Snorkelers can participate in the Whale Shark specialty course & snorkel at many dive sites. Some offshore dive sites we visit are subject to currents, so may not be suitable for snorkelers.

Divers must have PADI Open Water certification (or equivalent). As many dives can be to 30m max depth, PADI Advanced Open Water certification (or equivalent) is highly recommended.

Anyone wanting to gain their PADI Open Water during their stay at Golden Buddha can do so in just 4 days with Blue Guru Diving, which is based at the resort. The Advanced Open Water course can also be completed with Blue Guru Diving in just 2 days during the liveaboard trip.

Everyone will need to be medically fit to dive/snorkel or have a doctor's signed consent, evidenced by completing the standard PADI medical questionnaire.

EXPERIENCE WHALE SHARKS & MUCH MORE!

Feb - April is prime whale shark season on our doorstep in Thailand's Andaman Sea! During these months we offer a unique experience that supports eco-tourism and marine conservation with the opportunity to learn about, search for, identify & help track migrating whale sharks.

Graceful, rare & mesmerizing, whale sharks can grow up to 12.2 m long (although some 14m sightings have been reported), weigh upwards of 13.6 tonnes & live for 70 years. The most elusive & largest fish in the sea is found in warm tropical waters & it is believed to have originated 60 million years ago. Currently listed as a vulnerable species by The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), whale sharks are frequently targeted by commercial fisheries.

Relatively little is known about this magnificent fish & even less known about their mating habits, migration patterns & actual living population size. The Whale Shark Exploration Program's objective is to raise awareness about whale sharks & help protect this rare species. In particular, this involves learning how to safely observe whale sharks whilst photographing them to identify individual sharks & monitor migration paths. Participants will then have the opportunity to submit any photos & data to the ECOCEAN and Whale Shark Project databases.

Throughout the week, we also offer the opportunity to see & learn about a diversity of marine life indigenous to premiere dive locations in the Andaman Sea. Blue Guru offers a wide range of marine conservation activities & diving courses that will enable you to get even more enjoyment from your time underwater during the whale shark program & on future dives.

WHALE SHARK PROJECT BACKGROUND

ECOCEAN Whale Shark Photo-identification Library (www.whaleshark.org) is a visual database of Whale shark encounters and of individually cataloged Whale Sharks. It is maintained & used by marine biologists globally to collect & analyze encounter data to learn more about these amazing creatures. Unlike older tracking & monitoring methods that involve invasive radio tagging, ECOCEAN's primary tool is the underwater digital camera.

The Photo-identification Library uses photographs of the skin patterning behind the gills of each shark & any scars to distinguish between individual animals. Cutting-edge software supports rapid identification using pattern recognition & photo management tools. This technology was developed by Australian marine scientist & Rolex Laureate, Brad Norman. It is based on an algorithm pioneered by NASA scientists working with the Hubble space telescope to record & identify constellations. The breakthrough for marine biology & conservation came when Brad adapted & applied this formula to identifying individual Whale Sharks by their unique pattern.

Norman has been collecting information since 1994 & so far there have been over 4000 photographs submitted & 1200+ whale sharks are identified from all over the world. One of the most personally rewarding aspects of this research is that the technology allows individual sharks to be identified & recorded. For example, a whale shark spotted at Richelieu Rock by one of our divers can be identified the next day as the same whale shark spotted previously feeding in the Red Sea 1000 miles away. Brad Norman explains; "When whale shark photos are logged in our online library each shark is assigned its own number & when someone photographs the same creature again, both photographers are informed by email. In this way you can track of the progress of 'your' shark as others spot it."

Blue Guru Diving is also a registered operator for PADI's Project AWARE Whale Shark Project.

Your 4 days on board will also be packed with diving... 14 dives including 2 night dives. You'll visit some of Thailand's top dive sites including Koh Bon & Koh Tachai and one of the world's top 10 dives sites: Richelieu Rock, famous for its whale shark sightings!

Searching for whale sharks is exciting enough but imagine the exhilaration when you actually spot the largest fish in the world: truly awesome! The Whale Shark Awareness specialty course knowledge development will be completed over 2 days in the comfort of the lounge on board. You'll learn about whale shark's biology, distribution & behaviours, how to safely & passively interact with them and how to help identify specific creatures using their unique spot patterns. You'll be given guidance on how to take photos & record data on whale shark sightings. Your experienced instructor will also provide guidance on how to submit photos & data to the Whale Shark Project, so you can help support whale shark research & protection.

Obviously being nature, we can't guarantee any whale shark or other marine life sightings. However you increase your chances by being in the water!!

After disembarking from the liveboard boat, you'll be transferred back to Phuket airport (or surrounding area) for your onward travels.

LOCAL DIVE SITE INFORMATION:

Water temperature between Feb-Apr is about 28-29 degrees, so a 3mm wetsuit is sufficient. Visibility is usually about 30m but can be less in plankton-rich waters favoured by whale sharks.

Surin Islands

Located 60km offshore from Kuraburi & just south of the Burmese border, the Surin Islands are one of Thailand's most relaxed & scenic travel destinations. Surin National Park headquarters is based on Koh Surin Nuer. The Surin Islands boast fantastic snorkeling & amazing diving, especially around the south of Ko Surin Tai. In the shallows you will find very healthy hard coral reefs teeming with marine life. This is the place to see macro life in full force living in harmony with a large turtle population. Also common around Surin are sightings of manta rays & the occasional sail fish, as well as the possibility of Whale Sharks.

Richelieu Rock

A world top 10 dive site & the best place in Thailand to spot whale sharks, Richelieu Rock is an isolated pinnacle located 14km east of the Surin Islands, within Surin National Park. Being known for whale shark sightings is not Richelieu's only claim to fame.

Amazement awaits divers in every square meter of the dive site. From colorful soft corals to huge sea fans & sea anemones - the topography here is spectacular. The diversity of small & large marine life is un-matched anywhere else in Thailand & as such it's a favorite location for underwater photographers. Marine life spans from exotic macro life like ghost pipe fish, seahorses, frog fish, harlequin shrimp & nudibranch to cuttlefish mating, moray eels, octopus, barracuda, giant groupers & manta rays for those looking for possible encounters with larger species.

Koh Tachai

Ko Tachai is also within Surin National Park, 52km south of Ko Surin & 50km west of Koh Phra Thong. The main reef plateau is located approximately 700m south off the island & is completely submerged. The reef offers a plethora of colorful soft, hard & fan corals in combination with rock & boulder formations. Big schools of barracuda & batfish are regular sightings here & from time to time even the gigantic whale shark finds its way to Koh Tachai. Look for camouflage experts like the stonefish!

Koh Bon

Koh Bon is an island a few miles north of the Similans, part of the Similan National Park. The amazing underwater scenery includes an interesting wall that eventually fades into a long reef stretching down to a maximum depth of 42m. Manta rays are often seen here from Nov-May. You may also be lucky enough to encounter a whale shark feeding in the plankton-rich waters here. Koh Bon is a cleaning station for mantas & whale sharks and you can see them glide slowly past you while the cleaners do their work. The sandy spots at the deeper end are home to blue spotted stingrays, reef sharks and leopard sharks.

Similan Islands

The Similan islands are a string of nine granite islands 65km off the Andaman coast, providing breathtaking scenery above & below the water. The Similans are more famous for their rocky dive sites. Enormous granite bolder formations form numerous swim throughs, gullies and canyons. The islands are fringed by extensive coral reefs and home to a multitude of tropical fish, with frequent sightings of turtles, rays and sharks. Similan National Park Headquarters is based on Island number 4 and you may have an opportunity to go ashore during your trip to experience the beautiful white sands there.
